

Topic: The Woodbend Community Society – Major Capital Grant Request

Introduction:

As per Policy C-RP03, The Woodbend Community Society's request for \$13,074 under the Sustainability Grant – Major Capital Project for facility repairs and upgrades is being presented to Council for consideration.

Background Information:

The Woodbend Community Society is a very active community association that host many community events and programs, operates a playschool and is often booked solid with rentals. As time passes, the hall has begun to show its age and the community association is looking to address some infrastructure needs as well as update the interior and exterior of the facility. Repairs to the roof and flooring are required to maintain the safety of the occupants in the facility, while cosmetic fixes are required to update the interior and exterior to keep it current and inviting for renters and users of the hall. The inside will see a new coat of paint and the outside will see the addition of a community notice board and garbage & recycling bins in addition to the replacement of the picnic tables and benches.

The total value of the entire project is estimated at \$51,903. The Community Association has committed \$12,114 of their previously raised funds in addition to \$960 of in kind labor and have applied to the Community Facility Enhancement Program for the remaining \$25,755.

Analysis:

Administration has been very involved with this hall who is continually proactive in addressing maintenance issues. The Community Development Coordinator assigned to them has been in regular contact to this point and will continue to provide any assistance required until project completion.

Should Council approve the funding being requested, this project would be completed by 2016.

Alternatives:

1. Council could approve funding at a different value.
2. Council could choose to not approve funding for this initiative.

Conclusion/Summary:

Administration is recommending approval of the funding request. The Woodbend Community Society is committed to securing a variety of funds to ensure this project is able to proceed which is essential in the long term viability of the hall. The project meets all requirements under the Sustainability Grant – Major Capital and Administration will continue to work with the Community Association until the project reaches completion.

Woodbend Community Society Major Sustainability Fund Application Program Statement

Project Title: 2015 Repairs and Upgrades (Roof, Flooring, Painting and Outdoor amenities)

Introduction:

Woodbend Community Society and Woodbend Community Playschool located at 26002 Township Road 514, Spruce Grove, Alberta is to be the location of the renovations and upgrades both inside the facility and in conjunction with the sports fields maintained and operated by Woodbend Community Society. The Hall was rebuilt in 1998 and now has an issue of leaking in a portion of the roof. We plan to repair the roof with the funds provided as well as other upkeep such as flooring, paint and outdoor amenities.

The Project and Project Justification:

Our goal in securing this funding is to maintain the infrastructure and quality of service to the community and other surrounding areas. With our ageing facility we must maintain it in a safe, clean and inviting manor and to do so major upgrades and renovations are required. Keeping the hall in this operational state and standard will ensure that we can continue to accommodate social events held at Woodbend, Woodbend Playschool and pre-booked rentals of the facility and fill any other needs of the community.

Justify each project further:

Our hall that was rebuilt in 1998 has begun to show its age. In order to maintain the facility in a safe, clean and inviting manner, some major work is required to keep up with these standards.

A portion of the roof needs to be replaced due to the roof leaking into the building. This is an urgent matter as it is required to be completed before winter to stop any further damage to our facility and so we can continue operations of pre-scheduled events and community programs.

The floor of our meeting room and mezzanine (balcony) has begun to lift and crack which poses a safety hazard to its users. We intend to replace with a higher quality flooring material, commercial vinyl, to avoid any of the same repeat problems as well as requiring less maintenance than the current flooring which is tile. This again will allow us to keep up with our growing list of events and programs designed to help bring the community together at our site.

Repainting of the main hall, mezzanine, and play school is required due to years of wear and tear, discoloration, and repeated cleaning that has deteriorated the finish. As well we plan on making the playschool a more inviting and fun place for the children to enjoy their time at our hall by adding some more color, making it more vibrant than the current white color. We pride ourselves on having one of the cleaner, fresher looking halls and would like to continue to not look outdated to attract more members and guests.

For outdoor items we are considering both the environment as well as use by our members and public. We plan to install two new picnic style tables either made of aluminium or recycled plastic so they are both long lasting and maintenance free and two benches of the same finish to compliment the tables in our playground area. We have existing items in place but being made of wood products they have weathered since their original installation and are no longer safe and inviting. To compliment these items we wish to install a garbage and recycling bin near the sports fields and playground to keep the facility clean and litter free as we will surely see an increase in use. These three items will help make our outdoor area more inviting, safe and useful for the community no matter what the user has in mind from kids on the playground to families walking their dogs.

Lastly our facility being a meeting place for the area we would like to install a message board that can help post information both for our hall and in the surrounding community in regards to events, information sessions, and more. Installing a cigarette disposal away from our front doors to keep from people littering causing an eye soar to everyone coming and going from our hall and conforming to the Alberta law of needing to be five meters from a public door while smoking.

The executive sees great value in the outdoor amenities to attract people from the surrounding area, and for those enjoying the interior of the building these will help draw them outside the building to see the beautiful and quiet space our hall and Parkland County has to offer.

Program Requirements:

(In priority order)

1. *Roof: Replace lower roof*
2. *Flooring: replace and upgrade*
3. *Painting of main hall and playschool*
4. *Replace outdoor amenities: benches, tables, garbage and recycle bins.*

Site Factors and Considerations:

There are no site factors that impact this project because all items are either a repair of something existing or upgrading to better out facility that is already in place.

Financial Resources:

In addition to applying to Parkland County for funding we have submitted an application to The Government of Alberta via the Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) for 50% of the total Project cost. Woodbend Community Society is confident that our CFEP application will be approved to cover the majority of the project costs. The remainder will be Cash contributed by Woodbend Community Society and In-kind labour from our members and volunteers. Our contingency strategy would be to fundraise to cover the shortfall or put off projects further into the future when funding is available.

Approvals Required:

No external approvals are required. Once funding is secured the executive board will complete final approval before any project commences.

Implementation Responsibilities:

The project will be overseen by Herb Grynke (780-470-0574) and Curtis Schmidt (780-850-0696).

Proposed Schedule:

It is critical that the roof be replaced before winter to ensure no more damage to the facility. It is anticipated the roof could be complete within 2 months of funding approval subject to contractor and material availability. Our indoor projects will be completed within 6 months of when the funding is approved. The outdoor projects may need to be pushed to spring, 2016 completion due to weather.

Sustainability Plan:

Woodbend Community Society and its executive regularly inspect and asses the indoor and outdoor facilities and provide maintenance as required. This is expected to continue to keep the hall in an operational state. It is also Woodbend Community Society's mandate to have a years' operating expenses in reserve at all times
