


2019 OFF-SITE LEVY RATES AND ANNUAL REPORT

APRIL 23, 2019

OSL ANNUAL REPORT

- Bylaw 2015-07 requires an annual report to Council regarding off-site levies collected by the County in the previous year and the updated levy rates for the current year.
- The report includes information on:
 - Estimated infrastructure costs (which are sourced from the County's master and capital infrastructure plans)
 - Project expenditures (2018 costs that were previously treated as estimates have now been converted to actuals)
 - Off-site levy collection
 - Forecast development (staging)







2019 LEVY RATES

- OSL rates were updated for all 123 basins.
- Allocation of costs vary across benefiting parties, therefore some basins experienced a decline in rates while other saw an increase.
- On a weighted average basis the overall rates increased from \$82,492/ha to \$92,448/ha, a 12% increase.
- The OSL model utilizes inputs and information gathered from Engineering, Planning, and Finance departments to establish levy rates.
- All of these inputs have an impact on rate calculation, however there were two primary inputs that had the most impact on the 2019 rates:
 - 1. Development Staging
 - 2. Infrastructure Staging

2019 LEVY RATES

- Adjustments to staging information (infrastructure & development) are triggered by:
 - Current development activity
 - Anticipated development
 - New planning information (ie. Conceptual Scheme, subdivision application, re-districting application)
- EXAMPLE: Water Project #21- Zone 6 Water Mains
- During the model update in early 2018 the project was not anticipated for construction in the next 15 years, therefore the OSL/Developer share of the project was \$238,947 in 2018.
- Since that time, the County received new planning information (Zone 6 Conceptual Scheme and re-districting application) which triggered staging adjustment in anticipation of development taking place. Therefore, the OSL/Developer share of the project increased to \$4,930,181 in 2019.



2019 LEVY RATES

- Staging considerations correlate with development activity, as a result the developers (offsite levy) share of infrastructure costs has increased from \$176M (2018) to \$270M (2019) which is indicative of accelerated pace of development.
- Forecast land development has increased 7% from 1816 ha. to 1947 ha.



STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION

- Administration held an information (Q &A) session on March 28th, 2019 with developers and interested stakeholders regarding the County's Annual Off-Site Levy Report and proposed 2019 rates.
- No objections or concerns were received during or after the information session.

• The table below compares the weighted average of off-site levy rates in other municipalities:

| Municipality | Average rate per ha. |

| Town of Stony Plain (2018) | \$72,000 |
| City of Spruce Grove (2018) | \$86,497 |
| Parkland County (2019) | \$92,000 |
| Leduc County (Greater Nisku Basin – 2017) | \$109,000 |
| City of Leduc (2018) | \$128,000 |
| Strathcona County (Industrial Area 1 - 2018) | \$63,000 |
| Strathcona County (Industrial Area 2 - 2018) | \$224,000 |
| City of St. Albert (2019) | \$290,000 |
| City of Edmonton (2018) | +\$300,000 |
