

Purpose

The Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action Sub-Committee was established to:

1. Evaluate the Recommendations from the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action
2. Perform a Current State Analysis
3. Engage local indigenous communities and municipal neighbours
4. Develop an Action Plan by June 30, 2019

Background

On February 12, 2019, the Truth and Reconciliation Call to Action Sub-Committee Terms of Reference were approved by Council, and Councillors Jensen, Kobasiuk, and Hollands were appointed as sub-committee members.

The committee met in March, April, June, & October of 2019 to discuss options and draft a recommended course of action for Council. To inform this work, administration conducted an environmental scan including a review of:

- First Nations and Metis economic development entities and joint initiatives involving First Nations and or Metis communities in partnership with municipalities;
- Reconciliation work undertaken in other municipalities and regions, including Regina, Saskatoon, Heart of Treaty 6, Prairies Rivers, Winnipeg, Wood Buffalo, Spruce Grove, Calgary, and Whitehorse

On December 3, 2019 the proposed Action Plan was presented to Committee of the Whole.

Next Steps

At the presentation of the recommended Action Plan to Committee of the Whole on December 3, 2019 it was noted that the Sub-Committee had failed to complete items 1 and 3 to Council's satisfaction. Further, it was noted that the recommendations did not provide sufficient detail to give Council a good understanding of the cost and capacity impacts of their implementation. The report was tabled.

As a result of this feedback, the following next steps are recommended:

- Review each of the nine government recommendations from the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action.
- Discuss formal consultation with local indigenous communities on this topic and identify specific contacts, timing, and agendas for these meetings.
