Project Purpose

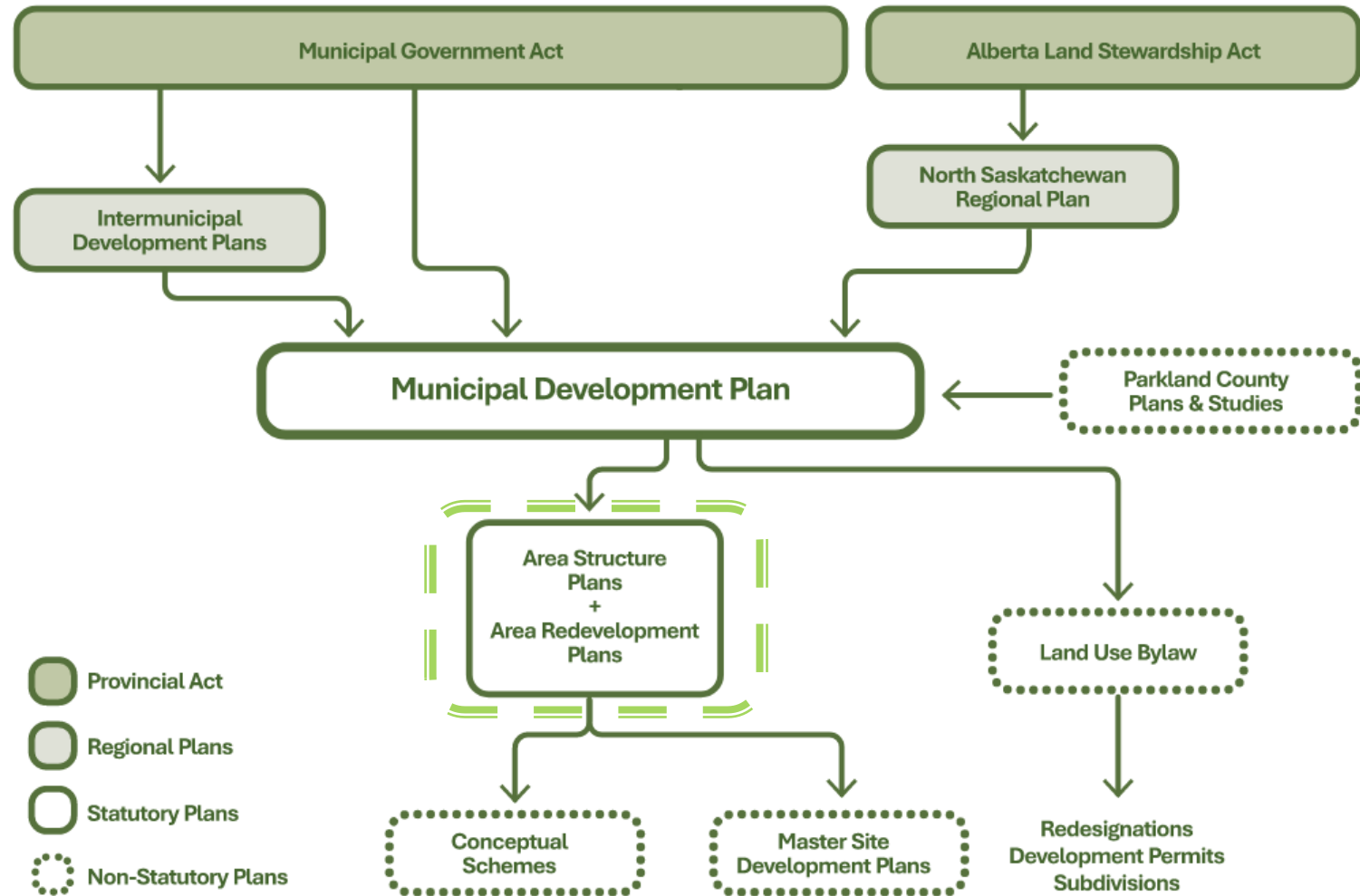
Determine the desired future state by:

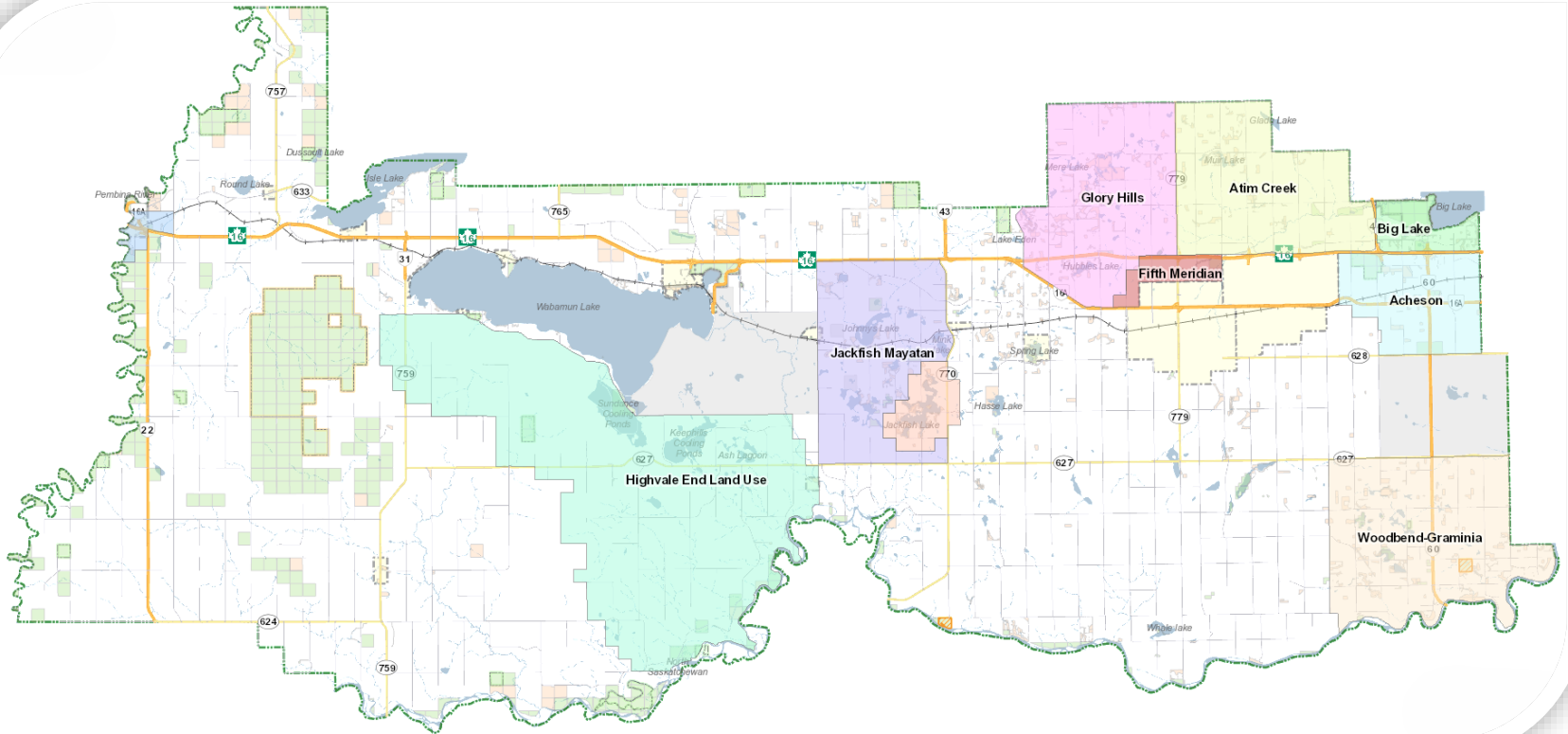

Give detailed policy direction to areas where development is more intense in use and more technically complex



CHALLENGES WITH EXISTING ASPS



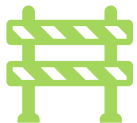
ASPs vary in scope, level of detail, and technical background



Majority of the County's ASP's have not been routinely updated



Misalignment with County's strategic priorities and changing economic, social, and environmental conditions



Barriers and uncertainty for the public, applicants and County staff

PROPOSED APPROACH

Information Gathering

- Jurisdictional Scan of rural ASPs
- Gap Analysis based on findings of scan

Evaluation Framework

- Use to determine whether an ASP needs to be updated, rescinded, or newly created

Internal Engagement

- Conduct Internal Committee meetings and workshop

Recommendations

- Run each ASP through the evaluation framework
- Create breakdown prioritizing ASPs and / or planning documents to update, rescind, or newly create
