**BYLAW 2023-17 PENALTIES**

A person who is found guilty of an offence under Bylaw 2023-17 is liable to a penalty not less than that established in this part and not exceeding \$10,000.00.

20	Disclosed false information when applying for a Fire Permit	\$500	\$1 000
26 (1)	Contravened any term or condition of a permit issued pursuant to this Bylaw	\$250	\$500
<b>Fire Restrictions</b>			
34 (1)	Ignite a fire when a fire restriction was in place	\$500	\$1 000
<b>Fire Ban</b>			
39	Ignite fire or discharge fireworks during a fire ban	\$500	\$1 000
<b>Fireworks Permit</b>			
41	Distributed, offered for sale, store, sell, use, discharge, fire or set off Fireworks or pyrotechnics displays within Parkland County without a valid Fireworks Permit.	\$250	\$500
44	Selling low hazard recreational fireworks within the County to any person under the age of 18 years.	\$500	\$500
<b>Fireworks Use and Discharge</b>			
53	Selling consumer fireworks within Parkland County when prohibited	\$500	\$500
<b>Release of Dangerous Goods Reporting</b>			
58	Failure to immediately report a release of Dangerous goods to Fire Services on public or private land	\$500	\$1 000
<b>Interference with a Peace Officer</b>			
84	Interference or obstruction of a Peace Officer in the exercise of their powers and duties pursuant to this bylaw.	\$500	\$2 500
