





Yellowhead: First meeting for IDP and ICF is being planned for late March / early April. **IDP:** draft project charter and IDP plan template is complete.

Lac Ste. Anne: First meeting for IDP and ICF is being planned for late March / early April. IDP: draft project charter and IDP plan template is currently being prepared by Planning & Development Services.

Economic Diversification

Accomplishments

- Champion Petfoods- Construction well under way. Completion targeted for august 2019.
- Pinnacle- Construction 95% complete. Expecting to start testing production in March.
- The Tourism area continues to gain momentum. A successful "Winter Warmup" event was followed by "Kids can catch" and a Tourism startup workshop. The emphasis on tourism has also seen an increase in the number of businesses looking to establish or grow in the County.
