Our application to Parkland County is for 50% of Clymont's cash costs, net of CFEP funding, to complete the project, or 25% of the total project cost. Parkland County's participation in the funding of this project will greatly assist the Clymont Community League's ability to complete the project on time and on budget. Parkland County's policy to hold the funds in trust until notice of project commencement is consistent with our cash planning.

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Clymont Community Hall Major Renovation Project

Introduction

The Clymont Community League is a member driven organization registered under the Societies Act of Alberta continuously since 1963. Clymont Community League operates the Clymont Community Hall and associated facilities adjacent to Highway 60 in the east end of Parkland County. The Community Hall celebrated its 25th anniversary this past September, and the Community League members, Executive and Board of Directors have identified a number of key renovations that need to take place in order to maintain Clymont Hall's status as a visibly successful facility open to all community area residents. These renovations focus on the kitchen, bar and main hall operations.

The Project

Clymont plans to complete numerous renovations to the interior aesthetic and kitchen and bar. Improvements include new flooring, ceiling tiles and baseboards throughout the hall, as well as new appliances, counter tops, dinnerware, glassware, flatware, and window for the kitchen and bar. All renovations are within the interior of the facility. These renovations will not involve the washroom facilities or entrance foyer, since these areas were upgraded in 2012.

The ceiling tiles in the main hall have been in place for the full 25 year life of the building and need to be replaced. While the ceiling is open, we will take the opportunity to upgrade and replace wiring as required to meet current codes. This will not only improve the appearance of the main hall, but will also improve its safety aspects and longevity. Rerouting of the HVAC controls to the kitchen area will also be completed so that heating and cooling are properly controlled for kitchen workers.

New solid surface counter tops and back splash and an onsite washer and dryer will allow kitchen workers to maintain the cleanest possible area for food preparation. A new vertical freezer will help reduce repetitive heavy lifting experienced with the current chest freezer. A new glassware dishwasher for the bar area will allow the hall to switch from disposable cups to reusable glassware, reducing waste and improving the quality of service provided by the hall.

The kitchen floors are well maintained, but their hard surfaces have been cited for back and leg strain among the kitchen workers. Current efforts to curtail this discomfort with local mats has been inefficient. Renovating the kitchen floor to a modern, worker comfort and safety oriented design is considered a key component to the project.

Site Factors/Considerations

Clymont Community League has a very demanding rental and community events calendar during the spring, summer and fall. The first quarter of the year offers the only opportunity for major construction renovations, and this project will need to be phased between 1Q2015 and 1Q2016. Smaller components of the renovations can be accomplished outside of the 1Q window, and will be done as time, money and volunteer effort are available. All of the work is indoors, reducing weather related challenges of outdoor construction and maintenance.

Financial Resources and Reconciliation

Clymont Community League applied for a Community Facility Enhancement Program ("CFEP") grant in September of 2014. A copy of that application is attached, wherein significant detail for the project, project financing, and quotations along with community league registrations and financial information can be referenced. As part of our capital planning, we have been collecting funds from bingos, a casino,

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fundraising dances, hall rentals and catering services to fund this large effort. We are asking that Parkland County assist us by granting \$42,000 toward the project, or approximately 50% of Clymont's cash commitment of some \$84,250. Clymont Community League has the cash on hand to cover its commitment to the project.

We trust that Parkland County will see that the Clymont Community League is a successful, responsible member of the region – and one that plans to continue on well into the future. We would consider these proposed major capital renovations to last, and be in continuous service, well beyond a ten year planning horizon. With the size, scope and longevity of the project in mind, Clymont Community League is making this Community Association Sustainability Fund Grant application with complete confidence in satisfying the requirements for the funding.

We note that the Community Association Sustainability Fund Grant has an identical reconciliation time line as the CFEP grant, meaning that Clymont Community League will be able to meet both reconciliations in the same time frame.

Implementation Responsibilities

Due to the significant number of subcontracted personnel, equipment and specialized installation, Clymont Community League will be hiring an experienced general contractor to supervise the renovations. We feel that experienced professional oversight will produce the best and longest lasting results. The general contractor will be responsible for the permitting process and meeting County bylaws, statutory plans, and provincial codes and standards.

Financial oversight will be provided by the Treasurer and the Grants Coordinator to ensure compliance with County and Provincial funding requirements.

The Clymont Community League, through its Board of Directors and Executive, will provide the oversight with respect to all matters related to the project.
