## Appendix A: Agricultural Statistics for Counties Served by West-Central Forage Association

West-Central Forage Association (WCFA) serves 6 counties – Brazeau, Lac Ste. Anne, Leduc, Parkland, Woodlands, and Yellowhead. These counties cover 10,088,572 acres (6.38% of province), including approximately 4500 farms on 2,539,840 acres of land.

These six counties dedicate approximately 50% of their land base to agricultural use. Yellowhead and Woodlands counties are covered in more forested areas than the others and therefore have the lowest percentage of agricultural land.
