Please find attached Municipal Policies and Procedures Manual - Section 4.1 of

the manual talks about AENV's Policy around approving a private development's

Water/Wastewater Treatment Plants. I would like to reiterate what I have told

you over the phone. We would ideally like the County to be the $\operatorname{Owner}/\operatorname{Operator}$ of

the Water/Wastewater Treatment Plants of the Private developments. Certain

Counties even have new policies around owning/operating communal water/wastewater systems. But if Parkland county is unable or unwilling to

assume responsibility for these communal systems, it does not mean that \mathtt{AENV}

will not be able to provide approval for these systems. There are provisions

under the Manual where the developer could help establish Home Owners Association who in turn could hire an utility or appoint somebody from the Condo

board who would help run the water/wastewater system. In this scenario, the Home

Owners association or the Utility Company as the association's representative

will be the Approval Holder and Parkland County will not have any responsibility

for construction, ownership, operations or maintenance of the water/wastewater systems.

Of course, the issuance of the approval is subject to ability of the applicant

to meet AENV requirements and approval would have several conditions with respect to construction, operation, maintenance, and reporting. But, the approval will not have any conditions involving Parkland County in operations,

ownership, maintenance or any kind of long term operation/maintenance responsibility. I hope this is what you mean by an "unconditional" approval.
