3.	Entrepreneurial culture – building & supporting an entrepreneurial business culture for the development and attraction of diversified progressive agri-business and agritourism opportunities. May requires investments in Community Economic Development Department – includes entrepreneurial training, new partnerships and liaison with industry.
