POLICY STATEMENT

The Council of Parkland County may from time to time receive and consider requests to officially name roads or sections of roads outside of residential subdivisions. Even though naming of roads shall be discouraged to avoid duplicate designations, this policy is intended to ensure that naming of roads occurs in a consistent and coherent manner.

POLICY

- 1. Requests for official sanctioning of a road name will be in writing and directed to the General Manager of Operations Services.
- 2. All requests to name roads inside residential subdivisions will be dealt with by the Subdivision Authority.
- 3. Names proposed for roadways should be positive in nature, descriptive of an area, in common use and of regional significance or frame. Use of personal names will not be considered unless they meet these criteria. All requests, in any case, will be subject to the approval of Council.
- 4. An official road name will not replace the rural address nomenclature but will complement it.
- 5. The Planning and Development Services Department will include officially designated road names on future editions of the County Map.
- 6. The Provincial Department of Infrastructure is to be contacted regarding supply and installation of road signs to be placed adjacent to primary highways. All other road signs will be supplied and purchased by the Parkland County Public Works Department.
