Start date: March 1, 2012

Project Description:

This project was developed as a partnership between Green Hectares and Parkland County. Parkland County has provided financial support for this project and access to resources within the county. Project Management of this project will come from Green Hectares. While the Green Hectares' Community Facilitator will be trained as an Enterprise Facilitator, she will be working with the Community Connector programs being developed by Green Hectares to help facilitate community organizations and individuals. She will be introducing them to the community, not in a marketing role but through facilitation. Parkland County is very eager to support this project and will have close involvement in the facilitator's activities.

Facilitator's Report to date:

Community Scans:

Community scans have been conducted to collect localized information on the electoral divisions within Parkland, as each community is unique. This information will be made available to the county and communities to be used in a variety of ways.

- All divisions have been completed as well an as an overall with Mayor Shaigec
- Partnering community Spring Lake has been completed, booking appointments to do scans with other surrounding partners

Rural Spaces:

The Rural Spaces program provides an online booking platform for rural community meetings spaces such as community halls, curling rinks, library rooms, senior's centers, etc.

Rural Voices:

Rural Voices is an online speakers bureau geared towards and designed for rural and agricultural audiences.

Rural Tech:

The Rural Tech program meets the current demand for training to upgrade computer and web skills in rural communities.

- Used 45 days over the summer at the rural libraries.
- Carvel Hall has scheduled them to be used as soon is wifi in hall is in place in October.
- Tri Cala is organizing their schedules and then will be advising us of the dates they need them for a program at APFA.
- Wabamun library will be starting a seniors program and using the lab

Enterprise Facilitation:

Trained as a Sirolli Enterprise Facilitator, the community facilitator also offers free, confidential business coaching to individuals and organizations. With a resource board to support the facilitator, connections are made to experts in the community to help them improve their business or get it off the ground.
