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What is a Trails Master Plan?

- Bridges together strategic plans (ie. Trails Strategy, Council Strategic Plan) with detailed tools (ie. municipal standards, development agreements)
- Identifies location and type of all existing trails on public lands
- Compares trends in recreation with what the County offers
- Applying an appropriate level of service, allocates the location and type / use of new trails



What is a Trails Master Plan (cont'd)

- Prioritizes trails through a phasing strategy on public lands and 'soon to be developed' private lands
 - includes a selection matrix a tool used to identify priorities
- Explores partnerships, identifying alternate sources of funding, thirdparties for long-term maintenance
- Identifies costs, other key elements such as signage and other support amenities (lighting, benches, etc.)
- Defines developer obligations to build trails as part of development

Probable Timeline

The following schedule identifies various tasks as part of the scope of work:

Trails Master Plan: Scope of Work

- 1. Focus on site assessments to evaluate existing trails, determine potential new alignments, understand site conditions that affect trail construction and costs
- 2. Review of land ownership, and means of developing trails on land not owned by the County (easements vs. fee simple purchase)
- 3. Minimal public and stakeholder engagement needed: plenty done as part of the recent Trails Strategy project
- 4. Final report that becomes a valuable planning and budgeting tool



Potential Trail Development: 2025

- Offering suggestions from the Trails
 Strategy document and others
- Created evaluation criteria prioritize potential projects
- Currently have \$800k for trail planning, design and construction
- Will require detailed site evaluation, detailed design, tendering, construction
- Able to build in 2025, if we start now; start planning for 2026 projects
- Council has ultimate approval of recommendations and next steps



Evaluation Criteria Considerations

- Number of County residents it directly serves, or within reasonable drive
- Resident focused
- Improvements to public safety
- Improvements to environment protection
- Providing an experience alike no other
- Enhancement to nearby facilities or amenities
- Enhances opportunities for singular use trails to reduce conflict elsewhere
- Partnership potential
- Costs

Recommended Next Steps

- Complete a Trails Master Plan in 2025 (\$55k)
- Commence discussions with RVA (river valley), City of Edmonton / Province (Big Lake), and Parkland School Division (Graminia, Tomahawk) for potential partnerships, grants
- Pursue land agreements for the Jackpine Provincial Grazing Reserve equestrian trail area. Conduct preliminary design of staging areas once approvals are likely, ready for future implementation (\$25k)



Recommended Next Steps

- Complete a Management Plan for Chickakoo in 2026, setting the stage for trail improvements & detailed design of new trails (\$125k)
- Administration to recommend trail priorities in 2026.





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
