Purpose of the Bylaw

 To regulate domestic animals and to promote responsible pet ownership



Summary

- Updated definitions and wording to create continuity throughout all County bylaws
- Simplified verbiage and removed ineffective processes so it can be understood and adhered to by residents
- More effective controls to enforce vicious dogs and ensure public safety
- Permission to hold hens on properties 1.00 1.99 acres with stipulations
- Ability for residents to apply to hold more than 4 dogs or animal/bird units on a property used for agricultural operations.
- Added section on Animal Abandonment.



Definitions:

• The section has been significantly updated to reflect current uses and updated language.

Responsibilities / Mediation / Discretion

- This outlines intent to create an environment where residents will take responsibility for their actions.
- Mediation services and officer discretion may be used to gain compliance

Violation Tickets / Tags:

- Removed first, second and third offence charges as it has not shown success in prosecutions.
- Addition of Municipal Tag section to be used as an option for fines.

False Information / Obstruction:

- Section added to reduce misleading or malicious reports.
- To deter members of the public to interfere with the lawful duties of Peace Officers.



Vicious Dogs:

• Removed the sections that were ineffective to enforce through a more efficient process that is conducive to improving public safety.

Hens:

- Section has been added to allow properties between 1.00 1.99 acres to house hens
- Guidelines for housing hens on smaller parcels were included.

Agricultural Operations:

- Allowance for agricultural operations to have more than 4 dogs or other animal/bird units on a parcel if those dogs are necessary for their business operations.
- Applications will be made through the Director of Enforcement Services.

Abandonment:

- APA does not have enforceable animal abandonment section.
- Abandonment section added to bylaw as a solution to problems we expect to encounter and are currently experiencing.
- At Council's request, we have added the reference to the Animal Protection Act when dealing with animals in distress.



Enforcement & Penalties

- Penalties
 - To be included in the Fees & Charges Bylaw
 - Based on a review of our current penalties as well as a municipal scan of penalties
- Enforcement
 - The Bylaw allows for the officers to us discretion, mediation and awareness
