



2022 NOT FOR PROFIT GRANT

PARKS, RECREATION, AND CULTURE

OVERVIEW

- Purpose of the Not For Profit Grant (NFP) :
 - Provide grant funding to not for profit organizations that support Parkland County residents through the delivery of recreation, culture, social services and/or community activities
- Eligibility:
 - A registered not for profit organization for more than 1 year.
 - Be an organization that has an open membership
 - Programs or services offered must improve the quality of life for Parkland County residents
- Ineligible Not For Profit groups
 - Community Leagues
 - Playschools (operational grant, eligible for capital)
 - Organizations that already receive government support for operational funding (operational grant, eligible for capital)

WHAT DOES THE NFP FUND?

- Operating (schedule A)
 - Financial assistance for costs associated with:
 - the operation of the facility and/or organization based on the previous years financials
- Sustainability Minor Capital (schedule B)
 - Financial assistance for costs associated with:
 - Fire, safety and health
 - Preventive Maintenance
 - Renovation
 - Equipment
- Project (Schedule C)
 - Financial assistance for costs associated with:
 - Special event activities
 - Development/launch of new projects or programs or a new component to an existing program
 - Volunteer training

FINANCIALS

- **Funding Amount:**

- Schedule A - \$10,000 max
 - ↳ 3,500.00 max for facility operating expenses
- Schedule B - \$5000.00 max
- Schedule C - \$5000.00 max

- **Eligible amount**

- The maximum combined total awarded to any organization under this policy shall not exceed \$10,000/annually

- **Historical funding levels**

- 2021, \$66,947.11 awarded (13NFP's)
 - ↳ out of \$124,081.17 requested (17 NFO's)
- 2020 \$66,871.57 awarded (16 NFP's)
 - ↳ out of \$181,911.91 requested (24 NFO's)

SCORING CRITERIA

- Groups are scored based on:
 - Technical review
 - Principal review
 - Percentage of total participants who are Parkland County residents
 - Number of Parkland County residents
 - Use of funds
 - Facility/Operating Expenses – Schedule A
 - Project Description – Schedule B
 - Program Description – Schedule C
 - Budget
 - Organizational Capacity
 - Alignment to Parkland County strategic pillars and/or supports a plan
 - Strategic Pillars
 - Developing community and community assets
 - Supporting physical activity and healthy lifestyles
 - Building an appreciation for culture, arts, and heritage
 - ↳ Plans:
 - Parks, Recreation and Culture Master Plan (2017)
 - Social Development Plan (2018)

SCORING CRITERIA CONT

- Why organizations don't score well
 - Low number of Parkland County Residents
 - Did not demonstrate alignment with strategic pillars or a plan
 - Organizational health

- Why organizations applications are rejected
 - Financials do not match grant requests
 - Incomplete application
 - ↳ Not supplying required documents
 - Not eligible due to policy
 - ↳ Membership not open
 - ↳ Fundraising event
 - ↳ Already receives funding from Parkland County

2022 REQUESTS

20 Applications received with a total value of \$123,170.41

– 17 applications met the eligibility requirements

- Funding Recommendation of a total value \$76,542.64

- Recommendation based on final scores for each application

- Increase in funding amount due to the addition of the NFP's within the hamlet of Wabamun

- Community sustainability committee review

- Committee reviewed the requests and recommended that the funding allocation follow the outcomes of the impartial scoring matrix.

2022 REQUESTS CON'T

Decrease in applications

- COVID- 19

↳Participant numbers, other funding sources, did not operate in 2021

- Organization is dormant or had not reactivated at time of application deadline due to government regulations
- No one writing grants due to organization being inactive or volunteer burnout
- Forgot about the grant due to organization being inactive.

• Advertising

- Application forms sent out to all previous applicants
- Promoted through ads in the newspaper and on social media

• Staff support

- Assist applicants in completing applications
- Follow up with applicants for missing/incomplete applications

2023 RECOMMENDATION

Based on the discussion at the community sustainability committee the following recommendations are being investigated for the next grant cycle:

- Tying the scoring criteria to Council's pillars and/or strategic plan
- Scoring criteria based on type; separating out the service based requests from recreation
- The addition of a smaller grant category for small projects and programs.
- Request participant numbers from applicants.
