PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Purpose of the Not For Profit Grant (NFP) :

- Provide grant funding to not for profit organizations that support Parkland County residents through the delivery of recreation, culture, social services and/or community activities

Eligibility:

- A registered not for profit organization for more than 1 year.
- Be an organization that has an open membership
- Programs or services offered must improve the quality of life for Parkland County residents

Ineligible Not For Profit groups

- Community Leagues
- Playschools - operational grant (eligible for capital)
- Organizations that already receive government support for operational funding - operational grant (eligible for capital)

WHAT DOES THE NFP FUND?

ANNUAL GRANT

Operating (Schedule A)

Financial assistance for costs associated with:

- the operation of the facility and/or organization based on the previous years financials

Sustainability Minor Capital (Schedule B)

Financial assistance for costs associated with:

- Fire, safety and health
- Preventive Maintenance
- Renovation
- Equipment

Project (Schedule C)

Financial assistance for costs associated with:

- Development/launch of new projects or programs or a new component to an existing program
- Volunteer training

Event (Schedule F)

Financial assistance for costs associated with:

- Special Events – community-based
- Sporting Event

WHAT DOES THE NFP FUND?

CONTINUOUS INTAKE GRANT

Micro Grant (Schedule D)

Financial assistance for costs associated with:

- Special Events
- New projects or programs
- A new component to an existing program
- Volunteer training
- Must occur in Parkland County

Emergent Minor Capital Repair (Schedule E)

Financial assistance for costs associated with:

- Unforeseen or unbudgeted emergency repairs or replacements
- Applies to specific items or infrastructure
- Must present an *immediate threat* to:
 - The organization's ability to operate
 - The organization's ability to provide services to the community

SCORING CRITERIA CONT

- Low number of Parkland County residents.
- Low % of Parkland County residents.
- Failure to supply required documents

Why organizations don't score well



- Incomplete application
 - Not supplying required documents.
 - Activities/project applied for will not be undertaken in the grant funding year.
- Not eligible due to policy
 - Event/activity didn't meet grant conditions


Why organizations applications are rejected

GRANT REVIEW PROCESS

- Scoring was equitable and allowed for an unbiased review
- Recommendations are based on the impacts/potential impacts the organization can have for Parkland County Residents
- Total amount of funding should be moderate to limit the overall tax impact
- Mandatory attendance at an orientation session led to stronger overall applications and reduced the time required for evaluation.
