





WABAMUN LAKE SUB-WATERSHED LAND USE PLAN

- Initiated in July 2014 due to:
 - Concerns by both residents and County Council
 - Need for better planning around our lakes

- Four phases:
 - ✓ phase 1: completion of the technical report
 - ✓ phase 2: completion of the Wabamun Sub-Watershed Land Use Plan
 - ✓ phase 3: completion of the Wabamun Action Plan
 - Phase 4: Lake Wabamun Toolbox (revisions needed)

PHASE 1

Issues:

- The number of different jurisdictions
- Various development regulations
- Current zoning districts do not consider cumulative effects
- Number of watercraft
- Lack of general public knowledge
- Integration of Wabamun plan into future documents
- Lack of understanding of groundwater

PHASE 2

5 outcomes:

1. protecting the sub-watershed environment;
2. supporting economic (development) opportunities in the sub-watershed;
3. reducing the impacts of development on the sub-watershed;
4. coordinating governance in the sub-watershed;
5. supporting sub-watershed stewardship programs and actions.

2018 REVISED ACTION PLAN

- 7 actions are in process
- 8 future actions are identified

<p>The Wabamun Sub-Watershed Land Use Plan (WLSLUP) was completed in three phases:</p> <p>Phase I—Technical Report Phase II—Wabamun Sub-Watershed Land Use Plan Phase III—Action Plan</p> <p>Phase I—Technical Report was presented to Committee of the Whole on December 1, 2015 and informed completion of Phase II work.</p> <p>Phase II—Wabamun Sub-Watershed Land Use Plan Resulted in 5 main outcomes being identified. Outcomes has separate objectives. Outcome include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Protect subwatershed environment • Responsible economic development • Reduce development impacts • Coordinated governance • Supporting stewardship programs <p>WLSLUP outcomes also informed the development of other key plans, studies and policies undertaken by the County. These are identified at the end of this section under "other project outcomes".</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Implementation Committee – An action coming out of Phase II WLSLUP was development of an implementation / ad-hoc Wabamun Committee. Membership would include stakeholders and other municipalities. <p>Aligns to WLSLUP outcome:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coordinated governance <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nutrient Bylaw: creation of a Nutrient Bylaw, if supported by Council, may lead to a reduction of fertilizer nutrients entering the lake. <p>Aligns to WLSLUP outcome:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Protect subwatershed environment • Reduce development impacts <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wabamun Lake Septic Program: Planning & Development Services has begun the Wabamun Septic Program. A formal "implementation committee" will form in 2018 and develop a TOR to be signed off by participating stakeholders and partners. • The ad-hoc Wabamun Committee has identified this as an action for 2019 to be developed by the County. • Wabamun Septic Program is identified in the Planning & Development workplan for 2018. Septic programs for other lakes / backlot owners are tentatively scheduled into late 2019 and 2020. • Program is currently in progress for 2018 and beyond.
