A Vision for Parkland County:

The 4 Principles of Agriculture

Principle 1:

<u>Integrated approach</u> – a recognition that a viable agriculture and food sector will require an integrated and supportive set of policies including land use, economic development and infrastructure investment.



Principle 2:

<u>Supportive (enabling) land use policies</u> – namely the design and implementation of land use policies (that respond to the context of different areas) that assure the long term future of agriculture.





Principle 3:

<u>Entrepreneurial culture</u> - building & supporting an entrepreneurial business culture for the development and attraction of diversified progressive agribusinesses and agritourism opportunities.





Principle 4:

<u>Fostering local leadership</u> – the creation of new momentum for a range of potential new directions and initiatives requires strong committed local leadership both within the community and politically.
