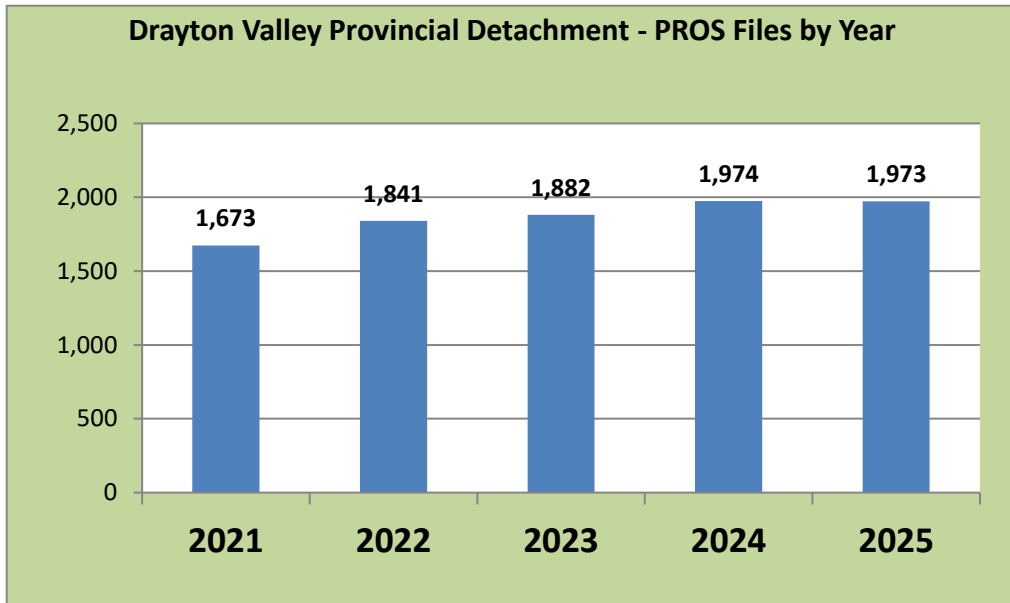

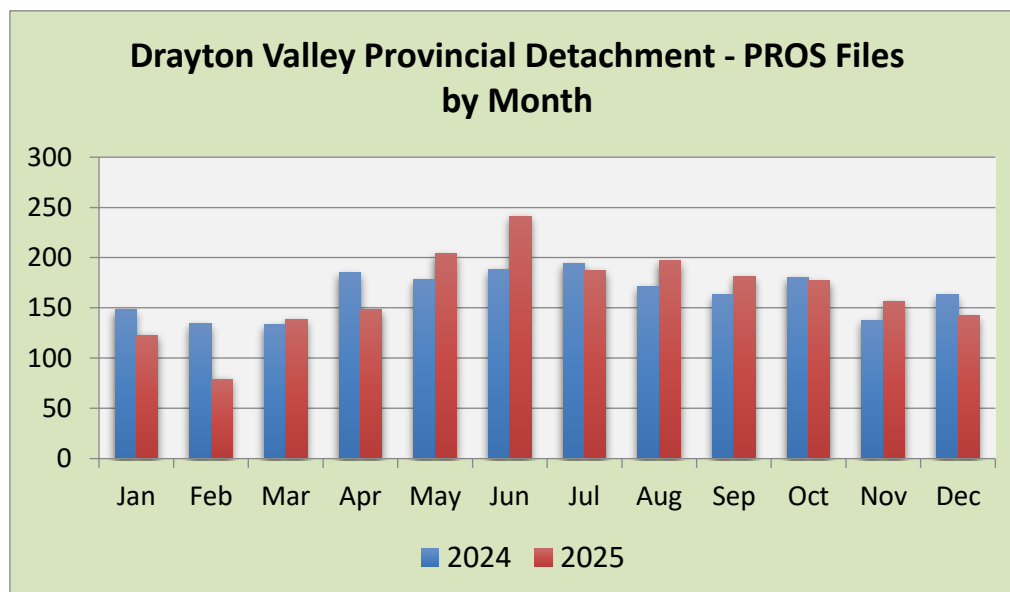
Drayton Valley Provincial Detachment (January - December)

File Counts

Based on PROS data, the Drayton Valley Provincial Detachment generated 1,973 files between January - December, 2025. This includes calls for service from the public as well as self-generated and proactive files. There was a decrease of 0.1% in 2025 when compared to 2024. Files generated by Provincial Traffic Units are not included.



In 2025 June had the most files generated (2024: July), while February had the least. (2024: March).

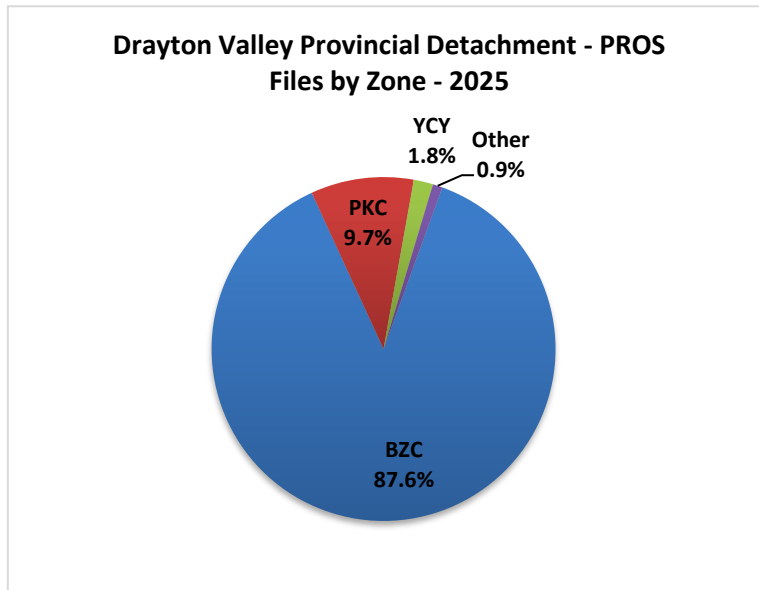

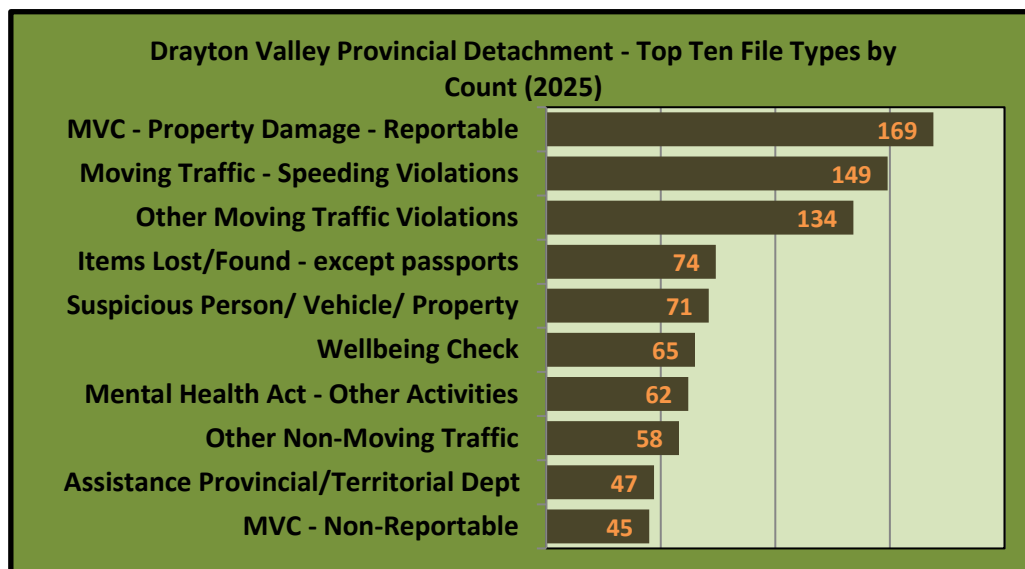
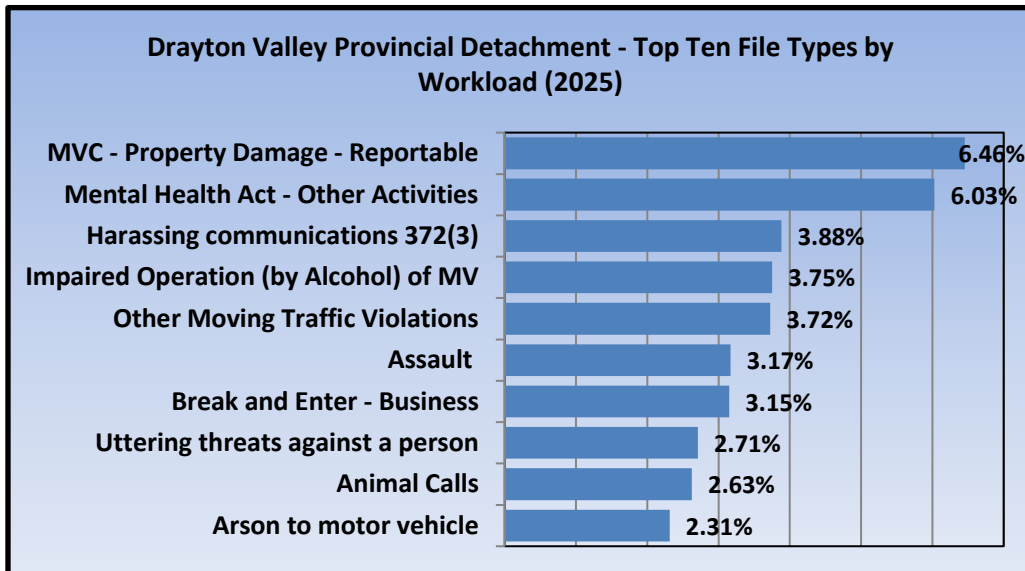

The two graphs below show the top 10 files types that were generated in 2025 both by estimated workload and by frequency.

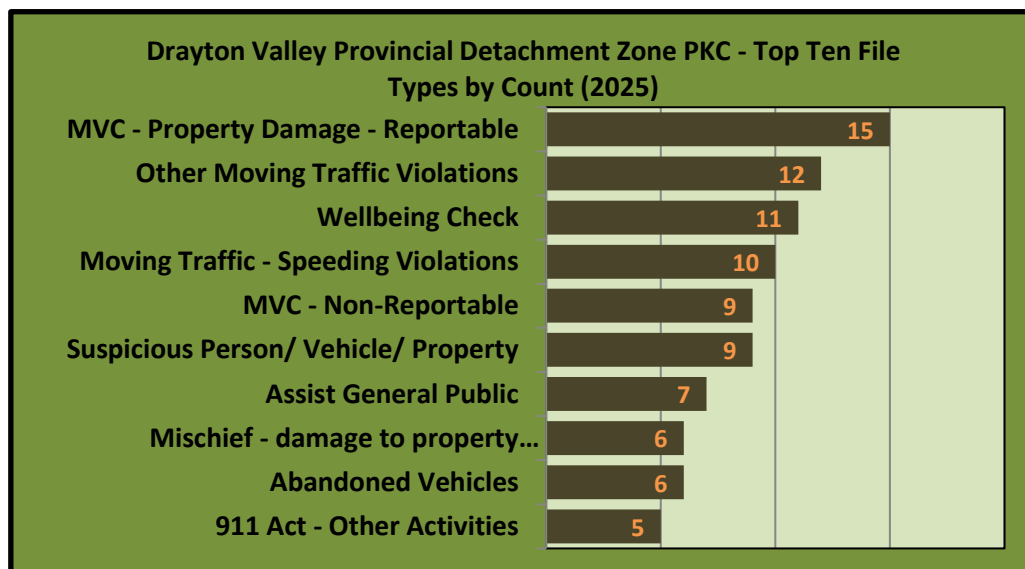
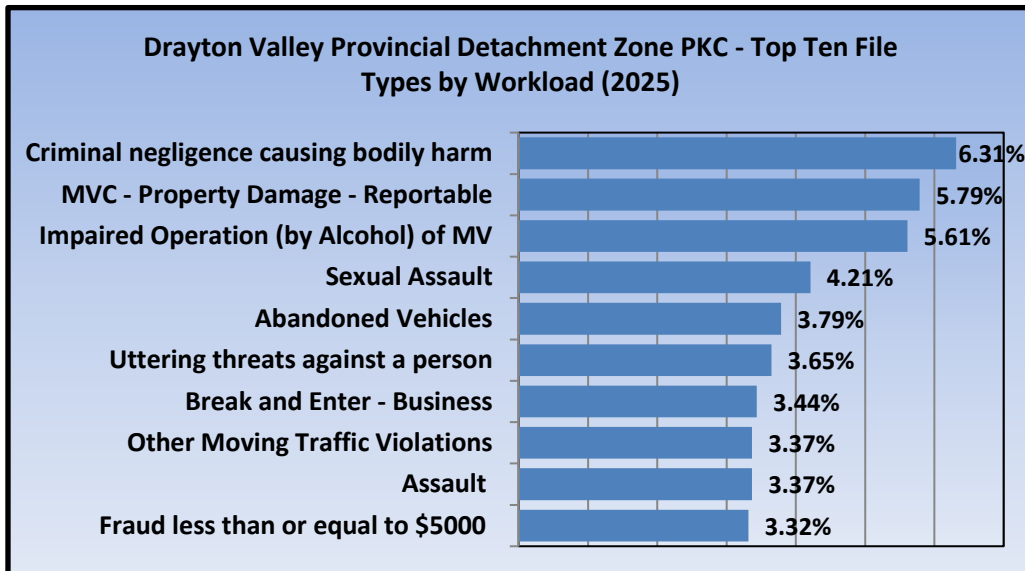




Drayton Valley Provincial Detachment (January - December) - Zone PKC

Community Priorities

Priority #1: Crime Reduction – Property Crime Prolific Offender Management

Updates and Comments:

This past year Drayton Valley detachment used tracking court compliance checks and proactive warrants to target prolific offenders this past year.

We set a goal of 3 proactive warrants and vastly exceeded that goal, with members writing 10 over the past year.

We set a goal of 120 court compliance checks and we also exceeded that goal by doing 176 checks.

Priority #2: Community Engagement

Updates and Comments:

Drayton Valley has stayed very active in our community attending numerous community events over the past year. We also planned and hosted 2 Town halls and an open house at the detachment.

Priority #3: Reduce Drug Trafficking

Updates and Comments:





This past year Drayton valley detachment prioritized the enforcement of those who choose to profit off drug addictions and sell illegal drugs. We set a goal of completing 2 proactive investigations. Our GIS team exceeded that goal, completing 5.

Priority #4: Crime Reduction – Police Visibility

Updates and Comments:

Drayton Valley committed to increasing its visibility this past year in both municipal community parks and school zones as well as county campgrounds. This initiative was successful, with Drayton Valley members completing over 300 community patrols.
