Stormwater Master Plan

- Council directed initiative
- Driven by continued drainage related concerns raised by residents
- County wants to have a better understanding of its role relating to:
 - regulatory and approval authority
 - operation and maintenance
 - infraction enforcement and
 - oversight related to stormwater management



Project Scope and Status

- Task 1: Basin Identification & Mapping complete
- Task 2: Regulatory Review complete
- Task 3: System Management complete
- Final Draft Report Submitted
 - Awaiting final review by Administration
 - Requesting Council feedback
- Future Phase 2
 - Scope of work to be determined
 - Requires funding approval



Key Findings What the County is doing right

- County is doing a very good job in managing most aspects of stormwater
- Current and recent initiatives that are excellent:
 - Asset management storm sewer
 - GIS LIDAR
 - Surface Drainage and Site Grading Bylaw (draft)
 - ALUS program



Key Findings Challenges

- Legacy developments
- Limited enforcement historically
- Complex natural drainage systems
- Landowner expectations for level of service
- Provincial regulatory environment (e.g. SG/SP flows meet 1999 Stormwater Management Guidelines)
- Historic licensed drainage ditches



Recommendations / Strategies

- Communications
- Regulatory Compliance and Enforcement
- Asset Management and GIS
- Stormwater System Planning
- Land Use Planning & Land Development Engineering
- Operation and Maintenance

Of note:

Legacy developments are addressed and have an element of activity in most of the listed strategies.




Communications Strategy

- Stakeholders with interests internal to County Operations will provide input and guidance to support:
 - Public communications program
 - Publicize stormwater triage process
 - Agricultural sector
 - Business / Industrial sector
 - Chronic problem areas
 - Surface Drainage & Lot Grading Bylaw
- Stakeholders with interests external to County will be engaged to develop a communications strategy on regional issues. External stakeholders may include:
 - Spruce Grove & Stony Plain
 - EMRB
 - Other rural municipalities



Regulatory Compliance & Enforcement Strategy

- Operation and maintenance of licensed drainage courses per the agreements with the Province
 - County's legal obligation
 - Update County's GIS data base
 - Determine need for drainage rights-of-way
- Refine enforcement and regulatory policies
 - Environmental approval checklists
 - Coordinate compliance with AEPA
 - Enforce Development Agreements
 - Drainage easements in previously subdivided lots
 - Adopt Proposed Surface Drainage & Lot Grading Bylaw and Lot Grading Policy



Asset Management and GIS Strategy

- Expand GIS spatial data
- Asset condition information for future rehabilitation
- Rural culverts
- Risk management approach prioritize and fund rehabilitation
- Natural asset management



Stormwater System Planning Strategy

- Detailed stormwater studies
 - Develop business case master drainage plans
 - Partnerships with developers
 - Local stormwater studies
 - Integrate stormwater and natural assets system planning
 - Joint stormwater planning with Spruce Grove / Stony Plain
 - Pre-development discharge rates
- AEPA "Fenceline" Approval Acheson / Big Lake Area
 - Best Management Practices
 - Document operation & maintenance practices
 - Continue to update GIS
 - Enforce stormwater approvals
- EMRB Stormwater Initiative
 - Apply Flood Risk Project Charter
 - Update rainfall Intensity-Duration-Frequency relationship
 - Ask EMRB about inter-municipal stormwater flows



Planning and Land Development Engineering Strategy

- Lot Grading Policy and Surface Drainage and Site Grading Bylaw
 - Adopt and implement
 - Educate and enforce
- Development processes coordination
 - Improve coordination
 - Refine Development Permit approval conditions for overland drainage
 - Review, amend or rescind County Council Policies
- MDP and LUB Updates
 - Establish minimum top-of-bank and upland setbacks
 - Amend LUB to align with new Lot Grading Policy and Surface Drainage and Lot Grading Bylaw
 - Update Subdivision and Development Application Requirements
 - Review and update floodplain overlays in key areas
 - Review County Policy C-ES04 naturalized stormwater management facilities
 - Bylaw prohibiting snow disposal in County watercourses



Operation & Maintenance Strategy

- Review mandate and resource allocation
 - Define mandate for level of service
 - Define response time expectations
 - Match O&M resources to level of service expectations
 - Document internal roles and responsibilities
 - Document O&M activities and follow applicable manuals
 - Refine flow, rainfall and stormwater quality monitoring programs
- Optimize Customer Resource Management system for stormwater
 - Refine CRM for incoming complaints
 - Refine CRM for post-event assessment

- Submit Final Report
- Administration & Council to identify Phase 2 priorities
- Define scope of work for Phase 2
- Secure funding for Phase 2
