What is a Mule Transport System?

A mule transport system is a specialized stretcher designed for patient extrication from remote or trail-access-only areas.

It features a rugged frame, single-wheel design, and adjustable handles, allowing responders to safely and efficiently transport patients over uneven terrain.

This system improves patient comfort and reduces physical strain on responders during rescue operations.
