





- PROS is the **P**olice **R**eporting and **O**ccurrence **S**ystem for the RCMP across Canada, apart from employees in British Columbia who use PRIME
- PROS integrates the entire scope of RCMP processes for collecting, managing, sharing and analyzing police information
- Sharing of this information will allow police services to ensure that the investigators have current and relevant information while conducting investigations that cross different boundaries and borders


# Break and Enter (B/E) and Vehicle Theft



- PROS: 41 scored as Break and Enter (B/E)
  - 22 were B/E to Business
  - 2 were seasonal/sheds/abandoned structures
  - 17 were B/E to residences
    - 6 involved entry to, or through the garage
  - 39 insufficient evidence to proceed
  - 2 still under investigation





- PROS: 49 scored as Theft of Motor Vehicle (including trailers and ATV's)
  - 5 were stolen while running or with keys in them



# Response

- Prolific/repeat offenders: Track and proactively investigate repeat offenders that are known for B/Es and vehicle thefts
- Increased patrols in crime hot spots
- Engaging specialized RCMP sections such as the Auto Theft Unit
- K Division Community Safety and Well Being Unit engaged with business and homeowners with CPTED consultations
- Operation Cold Start
- Lock it or Lose It
- Weekly media/social media releases on tips for prevention and awareness completed during applicable Crime Prevention Calendar theme months

# Parkland County Chop Shop, \$90,000 of Stolen Property Recovered


- Month-long investigation with Alberta RCMP Auto Theft Unit with the assistance of the Parkland RCMP Crime Reduction Unit.
- Feb 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 a search warrant was executed at a rural residence in the Parkland County area.
- Seized items included:
  - A stolen skid steer
  - Parts from three disassembled vehicles that were being re-sold
  - A stolen and re-VINed truck
  - A stolen and re-VINed trailer
  - A stolen motor and transmission from a Ford GT500 Shelby Mustang
- The estimated value of the recovered property is around \$90,000.
- 32-year-old resident of Parkland County was charged with multiple criminal code offences.
- The individual was released from custody and the matter is before the courts.



# Body Worn Cameras (BWC)



- Parkland RCMP was 1 out of 3 Alberta detachments chosen for the field testing (Parkland County, Grande Prairie, St. Paul)
- Field testing started on February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024
- Testing was deemed successful and the Nation-wide roll out is scheduled to start in Fall 2024





# Enhanced Services



- Parkland RCMP now has a Facebook Page that went live March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024
  - Followers increased from 0 to 1,100 since March
  - 33 posts created
  - Posts have reached over 100k people in the last two months
