STANDATA Service Annoucenment

Please be advised that the following persons are appointed as Administrators under the *Safety Codes Act*:

- Paul Chang, Building Administrator for the building discipline (includes energy codes); and
- Dean Morin, Private Sewage Administrator for the private sewage discipline.

Administrators are prescribed their powers and duties by the Minister of Municipal Affairs and may exercise any or all of the powers of a safety codes officer anywhere in Alberta.
