Mayor Shalgec called the public hearing to order at 4:00 p.m., in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, to provide an opportunity for public input and comment regarding proposed Bylaw 2018-20, and explained the process of the hearing.

Administration presented Legend Estates Redistricting Bylaw 2018-20.

Verbal Submissions:

1. Dick Haldane, Dentons Canada, Legal Counsel representing 1330397 Alberta Ltd. opposed to Bylaw 2018-20 and requests that this public hearing be adjourned so that the matter can be referred back to Administration to resolve outstanding items for the past ten years. The proposed Bylaw is for the purpose to ensure that no development occurs anywhere in the subdivision plan until such time that all deficiencies in the subdivision plan are met. Each lot in the subdivision plan should be considered individually as to the impact of the deficiencies and the risk for development for such issues as drainage.

2. Administration gave an overview of the engineering recommendations, studies, and reports that include stormwater and soil reports.

3. Morgan Russell, landowner and resident of Lot 14, Legend Estates, and owner of Lot 17, is opposed to Bylaw 2018-20 as it is unfair to all the landowners because the Bylaw prohibits development of all lots, including selling their property for another two-year period. There are no water issues where he lives. Fix the storm water problem to the north, but don't affect all the lots. Structural integrety has been checked and there were no issues. Soil samples have been taken, and there have been no issues.

4. Pat Munch, area resident from Legend Estates for 52 years advised that there is a drainage issue in Legend Estates that backs up onto their land. Ms. Munch further stated that the stormwater pond is above ground and water will not flow into it.

5. Jasmine Matias, landowner and resident of Lot 14, Legend Estates, and owner of Lot 17, is opposed to Bylaw 2018-20 and requested that not all of the lots in the subdivision be considered under the proposed Bylaw as not all of the lots are affected and that the issue is with Parkland County and Alberta Transportation related to the drainage.

6. Moe Farhat, owner of 16 lots in Legend Estates is opposed to Bylaw 2018-20 as it would further delay opportunity for development on all of the lots in the subdivision and requested that an exemption of the lots not affected by drainage issues be considered.

7. Morgan Russell, opposed to Bylaw 2018-20 as the caveat still prevents landowners from selling their property.

- 2. Subdivision lot owner, opposed to Bylaw 2018-20 as there are no safety issues.
