CSB SALT CONTAMINATION

Project Description

The County has committed to the responsible clean-up and mitigation of soil and groundwater contamination at current CSB salt storage located in Stony Plain. Contaminants originated from County salt mixing operations, hydrochlorides absorbed into soils and spread to groundwater

Schedule

- Delineation and Recommendations: Completed August 2020
- Construction: Spring 2021

Current Status

- Consultant has completed delineation and recommendation report for submission to Alberta Environment
- Final internal review currently under way
- Land and Water Act approval will be required which has a timeline of approximately six months; which moves this project into next year

Project Risk

- Unforeseen spread of contaminants

Budget

- Construction estimation: To be determined

Project Risk

- Unforeseen spread of contamination

Construction Team Value add

- Early stage constructability review and budget exercises

PCTS EXPANSION UPGRADE

Project Description

Enlarging the current Transfer Station building to improve customer service, adding two additional kiosks and roadways for traffic efficiency, increasing amount of bin locations and improving site grading

Schedule

- Initial: March 2020 to November 2020
- Adjusted: March 2020 to February 2021

Current Status

- New sawtooth areas completed
- New road infrastructure 90% completed
- Final stages of concrete work for new building to be completed
- New kiosks being constructed and completed

Budget

- Initial Construction Budget: \$6,131,100
- Tendered Construction Budget: \$6,102,784

Project Risk

- Existing conditions different than as-builts
- Poor soil conditions
- Winter construction conditions
- Design errors and omissions

Construction Team Value add

- Ongoing constructability review
- Intensive change order and budget management

ENTWISTLE POOL & COMMUNITY HUB

Project Description

The Entwistle Pool and Community Hub will be a new year-round facility intended to provide a variety of services to the Entwistle/Evansburg area including a library, seasonal outdoor swimming pool, rentable multipurpose space, and leaseable tenant space

Schedule

- Construction: August 2019 to October 2020

Current Status

- Completing deficiencies in building
- Pool in process of receiving diamond-brite
- Landscaping completed
- Regrading of alleyways and roadways in progress

Budget

- Tendered construction budget: \$8,562,838
- Estimated cost to complete: \$8,377,838

Project Risk

- Early winter for pool commissioning

Construction Team Value add

- No change orders that increased construction budget

OPERATIONAL UPDATE

Library

- Library staff are working hard to get the library operational
- Looking to open with limited service (due to COVID-19) by middle of October (tentative opening date is Oct. 13)
- Lease signed with Library

OPERATIONAL UPDATE

Front Counter Services

- Currently in the process of hiring the facility Customer Service Representative
- Anticipate opening front counter for residents to access some County services by the middle of November
 - Working with the customer service group at the County Centre we have identified a number of services that will be offered at this satellite location including:
 - Basic Tax inquiries and payments
 - Address changes
 - Utility payments
 - Enforcement complaints/inquiries
 - Map Sales
 - General complaints
 - Alternate pick up/drop off location for mail/packages
 - Fun bag pick up/drop off

OPERATIONAL UPDATE

Grand Opening

- We will postpone the grand opening to the spring when we hope that we can host a larger gathering safely, and to coincide with the grand opening of the pool

We know that everyone is excited to see the new facility and for the fall we are currently working on a way to offer pre-booking of facility tours to ensure that we can maintain a safe space while letting everyone get a peek into the new facility

WEST-CENTRAL FIRE HALL

Project Description

The County is constructing a new fire hall in the Village of Wabamun. The new fire hall will serve west and central Parkland County and will also enhance associated services for Wabamun and surrounding areas

Schedule

- Construction: October 2020 to November 2021

Current Status

- Contract awarded to Dawson Wallace Construction
- Contractor mobilized October 5th

Budget

- Tendered construction budget: \$7,984,000

Project Risk

- Unsuitable soil conditions
- Unknown underground conditions

Construction Team Value add

- Extensive value engineering and design review for risk mitigation
- Ongoing constructability review

ACHESON FIRE HALL REMEDIATION

Project Description

High water table and unsuitable drainage have eroded subgrade under exterior slabs and asphalt, and concerns that subgrade under building is being eroded. Parkland County to monitor and remediate where necessary

Schedule

- April 2020 – December 2021

Current Status

- Surveyed and monitored ground movement both external and Internal for approximately six months
- Determined that current building foundation is not at risk
- Significant movement of exterior approach slabs and asphalt
- Design completed for exterior approach slab remediation, design underway for drainage solutions
- Intent to remediate approach slabs before end of October

Budget

- Pricing underway for both exterior concrete remediation and drainage improvements

Project Risk

- Building constructed on a wetland
- Possibility when remediating one problem we can inadvertently cause a different one
- High hydrostatic pressure when constructing drainage improvements

Construction Team Value add

- In-depth investigations determine that no remediation has to be completed under building footprint at this time – Big cost savings
- On going risk mitigation

LEGEND ESTATES

Project Description

- Expanding storm pond capacity, regrading of entire storm water system to improve drainage across the entire site and adding riprap to all culverts

Schedule

- June 2020 – September 2020

Current Status

- Work has been completed; substantial completion review Thursday October 1, 2020

Budget

- Original: \$568,500.00
- Upon completion: \$642,949.89
- Additional scope was added during the project to ensure the best possible quality end product

Project Risk

- Risks are at a minimum at this stage of the project

Construction Team Value add

- Managing all stakeholders to ensure overall project satisfaction
- Ensuring schedule dates are met and in-depth cost review
- Coordinating with consultants and contractor to ensure successful project completion
