Bylaw 2019-21 Municipal Emergency Management

Proposed Motions

Administration Recommendation

Administration supports the proposed motions.

Purpose

New Provincial Local Authority Emergency Management Regulations will come into effect January 1, 2020. Proposed Bylaw 2019-21 will align Parkland County with the new Provincial Regulations.

Summary

Parkland County's Emergency Management Agency Bylaw 2014-15 was approved by Council at it's meeting held on April 14, 2014. Administration has reviewed the new Provincial Regulations and identified a number of changes to Bylaw 2014-15.

The changes to the Local Authority Emergency Management Regulations are mostly procedural; and, a summary of the changes include:

- 1. Expanded the definition of the Emergency Advisory Committee, its membership, meeting quorum, and purpose of the committee. This includes a minimum of one annual meeting.
- 2. Expanded the definition of the Emergency Management Agency, its membership, meeting quorum, and purpose of the committee. This includes a minimum of one annual meeting.
- 3. Added the role of the Deputy Director of Emergency Management into the bylaw formally and the process of appointment.
- 4. Added the process to follow when declaring, renewing, and terminating a State of Local Emergency.

Administration will present for Council's consideration, Municipal Emergency Management Bylaw 2019-21 at the November 26, 2019 Council meeting. Proposed Bylaw 2019-21 will repeal Emergency Management Agency Bylaw 2014-15.
